


ESSEX COUNTY – "North of Boston" region CY2017 Domestic & International Spending in Essex County *Reflects year over year growth

The Boston Foundation released a new report it commissioned through the UMass Donahue Institute on the impact of the Leisure, Hospitality & Tourism Industry in Massachusetts. It found "the industry is huge" with a tremendous economic impact throughout Massachusetts:

- · 3rd largest industry
- \$69.4 billion in economic activity
- Direct employment of 376,000 workers, with another 232,000 spin-off jobs
- Generates \$28 billion in visitor spending

But the report also highlights that "the state does not do nearly enough to market their industry with appropriate levels of funding . . ." The report recommends that "...to reach its full economic potential, funding must be increased for marketing and promotion within and beyond the state."

Where to Start & How to Get There

North of Boston begins less than 12 miles and 30 minutes from downtown Boston and extends to the New Hampshire border. Area airports include Logan International Airport and Manchester-Boston Regional Airport. Vistors can travel around via car, train (mbta com) or seasonally ferry between Boston and Salem (boston harborculuses com).


There you can find itineraries for one day, two days or a whole week of activities that you can do when visiting an area venue.

From Boston: Take I-93 North, I-95 or Route 1 to travel the length of the North of Boston region. Route 1A North follows the coast from Logan Airport to Salisbury.

From the West: Take the Massachusetts Turnpike to Interstate 95 North and Route 128 North towards Gloucester.

From the North: Interstate 495 South will bring you along the Merrimack River through Haverhill, Amesbury, Newburyport and Salisbury.

Spiru!

In 1637, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts proclaimed that no person should be in a tavern "longer than necessary occasions." There was no clarity on length or what "necessary occasions" were, and the region has since gone through various bans and prohibitions.

Some bans were self-imposed. Rockport until the year 2005 was a "dry" town. The fishing village was suddenly disrupted when a group of hatchet wielding women, led by local spinster Hannah Jumper, took it upon themselves to rid the town of its "demon rum." On July 8, 1856, the Hatchet Gang destroyed every bottle, jug, keg, and cask they could find, to the upset of local tavern and restaurant owners.

Today, local brewers, cider houses, distilleries meaderies, and wineries are resurrecting and reinventing old recipes into new ones, making their mark in the world of craft-style drinks.
